



FRASER CUP CHAMPIONSHIP



The Fraser Cup is awarded to the national playoff champion of the NA3HL. Formerly known as the Silver Cup, the NA3HL renamed the trophy the Fraser Cup back on September 11, 2017. The Fraser Cup is named after Robert 'Fraser' Ritchie, a long-time staff member of the NAHL, NA3HL and NAPHL.

On June 10, 2017, Ritchie passed away peacefully with family at his side after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Although Ritchie ultimately lost his battle with the disease, his influence and daily interactions with all of the owners, coaches, staff, volunteers and administrators in the NAHL, NA3HL and NAPHL, will never be forgotten.

"Fraser had a special place in his heart for the mission of the NA3HL and its most importantly, its players, so when we approached the idea of memorializing him with the renaming of the Championship trophy with the NA3HL leadership and the Ritchie family, they were unanimous in their support. We all felt honoring his memory in this fashion was a way to remind people of his influence on the NA3HL," said NAHL Commissioner and President Mark Frankenfeld.

Now in its 13th season, the North American 3 Hockey League, a USA Hockey-sanctioned Tier III Junior league, serves as one of the top training grounds in the country by providing the best coaching, exposure and developmental vehicles available for student-athletes in its classification. The primary mission of the NA3HL, which is managed organizationally by the North American Hockey League (NAHL), is to provide a structured developmental environment for student-athletes whose youth options are limited but are still reaching their potential and have aspirations of playing in the NAHL or United States Hockey League and eventually the NCAA or American College Hockey Association. The NA3HL began back in the early 1980's as the Junior B level Central States Hockey League (CSHL). In 2007, the CSHL changed from Junior B to Tier III Junior A under the USA Hockey classification system. On November 1, 2010 it was announced that the NAHL would take control of the CSHL. The NAHL-CSHL affiliation allowed for a more structured junior hockey system to provide athletes with more opportunities to advance to college and pro hockey. At the time of the take over the league was renamed to the North American 3 Hockey League



ROUND ROBIN POINT SYSTEM

3 points for a regulation win 2 points for an overtime/shootout win 1 point for an overtime/shootout loss 0 points for a regulation loss

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The five divisional playoff champions and wild-card will advance to the NA3HL Fraser Cup Championship Tournament, where they will play a two-game divisional round format followed by a semi-final and a championship game.

Seeding: The five divisional playoff winners will be seeded 1-5 based on their division's performance against other divisions at the NA3HL Showcase. Wild Card team will be the 6th seed

OVERTIME PROCEDURE - ROUND ROBIN PLAY ONLY


If a game is tied at the end of regulation time, a ten-minute overtime period shall be played immediately after an intermission of three minutes. The teams will defend the same goals as in the third period. The game will end when the ten minutes has expired or when a goal is scored; the scoring team will be declared the winner. If no goal is scored in the overtime period then a shootout will determine the winner. The NA3HL Regular Season shootout procedures will apply. Overtime shall be played with each team at the numerical strength of five (5) skaters and one (1) goaltender.

OVERTIME PROCEDURE - SEMI-FINALS AND FINALS

If the score is tied after three periods of play in the Semi-Finals or Finals, the following shall take place:

- A. Teams will return to dressing rooms and the ice shall be resurfaced. A fifteen-minute intermission will take place.
- B. A twenty-minute, sudden death, overtime period shall be played with 5 skaters a side.
- C. The game shall terminate upon a goal being scored and the Club scoring declared the winner. If no goal is scored, the same procedure as above shall be repeated until a winner has been determined.
- D. Clubs will change ends each overtime period

ROAD TO THE CUP



The Alexandria Blizzard are making their first ever appearance at the Fraser Cup. The Blizzard finished the regular season with a record of 32-12-3, good for second place in the fierce West Division. In the postseason they drew the Mason City Toros in the first round. They survived a late comeback to take Game 1 before dropping Game 2 on the road, forcing a winner-take-all Game 3. After leading by one through 40 minutes, the Blizzard exploded for six third period goals to advance with a 9-2 win. In the West Division Finals, special teams played a difference in Game 1 as Alexandria scored three power play goals and a shorthanded tally in a 4-2 win over Granite City. In Game 2, with a raucous crowd behind them, the Blizzard came out flying, scoring the first three goals of the game and would go on to win the game 3-2 and the series 2-0 to advance as the West Division Champions



The Helena Bighorns started a bit slow in the regular season, falling behind in the standings in the first half of the season. The team turned things around just as the new year began as they went on a 17 game winning streak to vault themselves into first place, finishing with a 36-8-3 record. They finished tied with the Gillette Wild but their 4-2 head to head record gave them the regular season title. In the opening round of the playoffs, Helena got everything they could from the Butte Cobras. A late goal got them to overtime and Tyler Alldredge scored just 42 seconds into the extra period to give them the win in Game 1. They would return home and shutout the Cobras 3-0 to sweep the series. In the Frontier Division Finals, they would drop Game 1 to the Gillette Wild by a score of 5-2. With their backs against the wall they would respond with a 5-0 victory on home ice, setting up a do-or-die Game 3. The Bighorns jumped out to a 4-0 lead and survived a last ditch effort from Gillette to win the game 5-2 and advance to the Fraser Cup for a second consecutive year.



2023 marks the third consecutive trip to the Fraser Cup for the Northeast Generals. After failing to make it out of pool play in 2021, Northeast made it all the way to the semifinals before falling to Granite City. Many players from last year's club return to Missouri with one goal on their minds. The Generals finished the regular season with the best record in the league at 41-4-2. They swept their first round series against the Long Beach Sharks, winning their two games 9-3 and 2-1. They met up with the Danbury Jr. Hat Tricks in the East Division Finals and put on some offensive fireworks. They won Game 1 by a score of 12-2 and put the finishing touches on the series sweep with a 6-1 win in Game 2. They come into this tournament as hot as anyone and will look to become the first East Division team to take home the Fraser Cup.

ROAD TO THE CUP

In their third season in team history, Oregon was tied for first place heading into the final weekend of the regular season. But dropping their last three games dropped them to a 31-10-6 record and into second place in the Central Division. Oregon got revenge on Milwaukee, the team that swept them the week before with a 2-1 win in Game 1. Then in Game 2, it took 88 minutes but Dillon Schmidt's goal in double overtime lifted the Tradesmen to a series sweep. In the Central Division Finals, the Tradesmen carried that momentum as they rolled the defending Fraser Cup champions, the Rochester Grizzlies in back to back games. A dominant 4-1 win on the road gave them a chance to punch their Fraser Cup ticket on home ice. Not only would they clinch their spot here in St. Peters, but they made a statement, cruising to a 7-0 shutout in Game 2 as they were crowned Central Division Champions for the first time in team history.



The Texas Brahmas spent most of their season in second or third place battling for positioning with the Louisiana Drillers and Texas RoadRunners. The Brahmas would finish in second place in the South Division with a record of 34-11-2. Like most seasons Texas was ranked near the top defensively as they allowed just 100 goals in 47 regular season games. In the playoffs, they were matched up with the Louisiana Drillers, playing one of the most entertaining postseason games in Game 1. Henry McRoberts scored just before the buzzer in overtime to lift the Brahmas to a 4-3 victory. After losing Game 2 in Louisiana, the Brahmas came back with a resounding 4-1 win to take the series two games to one. In the South Division Finals, the offense was on full display in Game 1 as six different players scored in a 6-3 decision. The following day, the Brahmas punched their ticket with a 3-1 win in Game 2. They'll aim for the first Fraser Cup championship since 2019.



The Granite City Lumberjacks started the season red hot, jumping out to a commanding lead in the division that they would never relinquish. A 39-6-2 record would give them the West Division regular season title and the second most points in the NA3HL. In the first round of the playoffs, the Lumberjacks quickly dispatched the Willmar WarHawks winning 7-1 in Sauk Rapids. The next night they would overcome a 2-0 deficit and score four unanswered to win the game 4-2 and the series 2-0. In the West Division Finals, the Alexandria Blizzard would take the Jacks on home ice by a score of 4-2 and then finish off the sweep the following night in a 3-2 decision. The Lumberjacks qualify as the Wild Card team as they had the most points of the five teams that lost in the Division Finals. Granite City will be a on revenge tour this time around in St. Peters as they fell in the Fraser Cup Final last season to the Rochester Grizzlies. They've won the Fraser Cup three times, the most recent championship coming in 2017.

2023 NAHL & NA3HL DRAFTS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who is eligible for the drafts?

Amateur players less than 21 years of age on December 31, 2023 who are not listed on an NAHL/NA3HL team roster, or are listed on an NAHL/NA3HL team roster but played less than (10) NA3HL regular season and/or playoff games during the 2020-21 season and did not accept a tender from an NAHL/NA3HL team prior to the draft date(s), are eligible for selection in the drafts

Do prospective players have to register for the drafts?

No, there is no registration process to be eligible for the NAHL or NA3HL drafts

Are drafted players eligible to try out for other teams?

Unless agreed upon in writing by the two NAHL/NA3HL teams, tendered or drafted players are not eligible to try out for other teams in the respective league.



Are drafted players eligible to try out for teams in other junior leagues?

Yes, all tendered and drafted players are eligible to try out for any team in any league other than the NAHL/NA3HL in the U.S. and Canada.

What if a prospective player is not drafted, but is still interested in playing the NAHL/NA3HL?

Players not drafted but who still want to play in the NAHL or NA3HL are encouraged to attend individual teams' open tryout camps.





NA3HL ALUM GETS DIVISION I OPPORTUNITY

Brendan Studioso thought his hockey career was coming to an end.

After four years and three seasons with the Arizona State University ACHA hockey team, Studioso figured he had just a few laps left around the ice.

Then his phone buzzed.

"I saw a text from the D1 coach, Greg Powers, and I was like huh?" Studioso recalled, "I showed my buddy and I thought maybe this will be the call up."

Sure enough, it was the call that the senior forward had dreamed of. He was being pulled up the NCAA Division I team.

Days later, Studioso was in the lineup for the Sun Devils as they took on the University of Alaska-Anchorage, coincidentally against his former coach in North Iowa, Kevin Murdock. With just over three minutes remaining and his team up 4-0, Studioso was put on to the first power play unit and found some space in the offensive zone. The native of Mukilteo, Washington let go a one timer that found the back of the net for his first NCAA goal.

"The other guys were in there before me so I stuck back at the point a little bit and saw a lane so I backed up, I got a great pass, and I was able to get a nice bounce off the defenseman. It was just a crazy experience," said Studioso.

The forward would appear in three games with the Division I team after a very successful career with the ACHA team. In his senior year, he led the team in scoring with 28 goals and 48 points in just 33. For his collegiate career, Studioso found the back of the net for 51 goals and 116 points in 99 games.

Studioso played in the NA3HL for three full seasons with the North Iowa Bulls, wearing the captain's "C" in his final year. He scored 59 times and finished his career with 143 points. He was called up to the NAHL a couple times, scoring a goal in eight appearances. He also scored 10 goals and 22 points in 19 playoff contests.

"A lot of guys were reaching out and congratulating me and that felt really cool to hear from my old friends. That was probably the best part of this," exclaimed Studioso. "It's been really cool to connect with some people I haven't chatted with in awhile. It's pretty cool to see how big this story really got."

2023 NAPHL SPRING TOP PROSPECTS TOURNAMENT

Welcome to the inaugural NAPHL Spring Top Prospects Tournament, over the next three days four teams will battle one another for the right to be named the Spring champion. The event is held in conjuction with the NA3HL Fraser Cup and the NAHL St. Louis Combine. Scouts from all NAHL teams as well as many NCAA scouts will be in attendance looking for the next crop of talent to load their rosters with.

Both our 16U T1ER and 18U SHOW leagues have assembled two teams to compete against each other. This will allow for our SHOW Top Prospects teams to showcase themselves not only with NA3HL coaches and scouts but also NAHL, NCAA and ACHA coaches and scouts. This also benefits our 16U T1ER Top Prospects teams by allowing them to begin competing against older competition and begin to get on the map of NAHL and NCAA programs. 
